Environmental Portfolio Report for June 2024

Footpaths

We have completed the fourth round of footpath trimming, and hopefully will start again in July subject to weather.

During the month I received an email complaint from a resident on the Bulbery Estate concerning a fallen tree across a path and now leaning on there fence and garden shed. It turns out the path is not registered footpath, it goes from the Sports Field to the Bulbery Estate and bordering the School Field, Abbotts Ann Estate land and three residents' properties. TVC, the School and Abbotts Ann estate say its not their land, I have also contact ASTER who own a few properties and land to see if its not their land, to date I have had no feed back. If they do not own the land, who is responsible for cutting down the tree?

Sewage

I am pleased to confirm we have had no spillage this month, and no tanker requires for any of the parishes, it would seem SW work in sealing sewer pipes over the last 18 months is working even though we still have high ground water levels for this time of the year.

We had a quarterly PPPF meeting with Southern Water this month (minute of meeting available on request) to discuss various outstanding issues, the main one for our parish is the valve issue at Mill Lane, SW say they are working a solution to fit a automatic control valve to overcome the problem, when this will happen is anybody's guess.

Highways and Paths

I have had no feed back from HCC when they will be coming to clean out thirty-four blocked drains in our village which causes flooding when we have heavy rain.

The hedge problems along Little Ann Road have now been resolved by the residents cutting their hedges bordering the pavement, after receiving a letter from AAPC.

Kick Sampling


We are getting a healthy variety & abundance of the key species we look for. See over the page.

We have benefited from the high water levels in the brook as this has increased flow and helped clean the gravel bottom. Levels in the brook still remain above average but are now falling as is the rate of flow.

Groundwater

Underpinning levels in the brook is groundwater.
Catchment groundwater levels are measured by the EA at Clanville Gate borehole.
Although the level is falling by ~ 6 cm per day it is still exceptionally high at 87.28 m. In the valley levels are also falling but at a much reduced rate.


It will be interesting to map when and how our winterbournes start to dry.

More Education - Koala

A local charity, More Education, operating as Koala, has been given £50K from Test Valley Borough Council to launch a new community hub. The charity is providing support to autistic and neurodivergent people between the ages of 5 and 18 who are unable to access mainstream education. To help address some of this need, Koala wanted to create a dedicated space to enable them to expand their offer of hybrid learning and tutoring sessions, as well as creating a special interest library.

More Education (Koala) identified an empty unit in the Chantry Centre as the perfect spot, but needed funding to adapt the space to best meet the needs of their users, including installing a platform lift, accessible toilets and other critical work.

Koala applied for £50,618 from TVBC's Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) pot, and councillors approved the funding at a cabinet meeting on Wednesday 28 May.

It is estimated that the facility will assist an additional 40 to 50 children and young people through tutoring and distance learning. The space will also have the potential to be used by other similar organisations as part of a wider network of support and will benefit users across Test Valley.

Funeral home visits

Following the distressing incident at Legacy Independent Funeral Directors in Hull and East Riding, the Council's Environmental Health team visited a number of funeral homes within the borough. These visits have been positive and have not found any concerns to pass onto the police.

Update from Hampshire County Council - July 2024

£3.8 million awarded to Hampshire for even more fast-track employment training

Hampshire's Skills Bootcamp training is to run again for a further year, thanks to an award of £3.8 million from the Department for Education (DfE)

This free, fast-track training programme is offered to Hampshire residents and employers, enabling both those in work and job seekers to gain further training and secure higher paid roles, with employers benefitting from upskilled employees.

Skills Bootcamp training will boost Hampshire's economy and increase productivity by helping businesses fill specific vacancies which require skills that currently are in short supply.

The courses are flexible with learning planned to fit around professional and family commitments allowing people in different circumstances to gain the skills employers are looking for.

For most Skills Bootcamp courses, no previous knowledge in the subject is needed. Courses can be classroom-based, on-the-job or online and unemployed participants are guaranteed a job interview at the end of their course.
